

TWO BACK-TO-BACK WORLD CHAMPIONS AND A NEW SENIOR MEN'S KING CROWNED IN PORTO

Alvin Medailleu and Viktoria Derschiewzki successfully defend their World titles as Siard Span takes Senior Men's gold at an electrifying 2026 World Freestyle Trampoline Championships

PORTO, PORTUGAL — August 23, 2026 — Six unforgettable days of competition, international talent and high-flying action came to a spectacular close in Porto as three new World Championship titles were decided at the **2026 Freestyle Trampoline World Championships**.

More than **100 athletes representing approximately 20 countries** descended on Porto for the biggest international gathering of freestyle trampoline athletes to date, transforming the city's beachfront into a celebration of sport, creativity and progression. And when the final jumps were landed, two reigning champions had successfully defended their crowns — while a new Senior Men's World Champion emerged.

ALVIN MEDAILLEU GOES FOR TWO IN THE JUNIOR DIVISION

Sweden's **Alvin Medailleu** once again proved why he is one of the most exciting young athletes in freestyle trampoline. Medailleu successfully won the title for the second time, claiming his previous win in 2024. This year, his Junior World Championship title was even more impressive with an outstanding **51.50-point performance**, the **highest Finals score recorded across any division** at the 2026 Championships. His combination of difficulty, execution and creativity secured another World title and reinforced his position as one of the sport's brightest rising stars.

VIKTORIA DERSCHIEWZKI DEFENDS THE WOMEN'S WORLD TITLE

Germany's **Viktoria Derschiewzki** delivered when it mattered most, successfully defending her Senior Women's World Championship crown with a Finals score of **45.66**. Facing an increasingly competitive international women's field, Derschiewzki once again demonstrated the consistency, technical ability and creativity required to stand at the top of the sport.

SIARD SPAN CROWNED NEW MEN'S WORLD CHAMPION

In the Senior Men's division, the Netherlands' **Siard Span** rose to the occasion with a huge Finals performance, earning **49.88 points** and the title of **2026 Senior Men's World Champion**. The victory crowns Span at the top of one of the deepest international men's fields the sport has seen and adds his name to the growing history of Freestyle Trampoline World Champions.

PORTO DELIVERS A WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP WITH A DIFFERENCE

The 2026 Championships marked the first time the event was staged in Porto, with the beachfront setting creating one of the most distinctive World Championship environments in the sport's history. Throughout the week, athletes, families and spectators experienced much more than competition.

The event combined world-class freestyle trampoline with music, entertainment, athlete interaction and public activities, including the **ACON Action Zone** and family-focused activations, helping turn the venue into a true festival of freestyle sport. The open setting also introduced freestyle trampoline to thousands of people who had never experienced the sport live before.

"Porto gave this World Championships a completely different personality," said **Trish McGeer, President and CEO of the Freestyle Trampoline Association**.

"We brought together an incredible group of athletes from around the world, put them in a spectacular environment and gave the public the opportunity to experience freestyle trampoline up close. You could feel throughout the week that this sport is growing into something much bigger."

"What excites me most is that we are still at the very beginning. The level of the athletes, the international interest and the audience around freestyle trampoline are all developing incredibly quickly. The World Championships have enormous room to grow over the next several years."

Born largely through social media and athlete creativity, freestyle trampoline has evolved rapidly from an online movement into an increasingly structured international sport.

Its athletes combine extreme technical difficulty with individual style, creativity and progression — producing a format designed for both live audiences and the digital generation.

With international participation continuing to expand, new competitions being developed and media distribution growing, the FTA expects the World Championships to increase significantly in scale and global reach over the coming years.

Porto 2026 provided another major step forward.

And after six days of competition on the Portuguese coast, one thing was unmistakable:
